

Journalists win Front Page award

Two reporters from the London office of Children's Express collected their award from Andrew Neil at a ceremony at the British Library.

Best Writing Award, September 2006

Ginisha Sadasivan and Annabel McLeod won the best writing award in the over 16+ category in the British Library's **Front Page** competition for their article focusing on the plight of young asylum seekers in the UK.

The judging panel included Faisal Islam, Business Correspondent at Channel Four News; Mark Porter, Creative Editor of the Guardian; and ex-editor and broadcaster Andrew Neil.

They were "bowled over" with the piece that focused on an 17-year-old from Eritrea, who arrived by herself in the UK several years ago.

The judges said the first-hand accounts it presented, and depth of research, were impressive, and made it the most publishable article submitted. Ginisha and Annabel have won a week's work experience each at a daily national newspaper.
