Animals are for looking after and loving and not to be chucked out on the street.

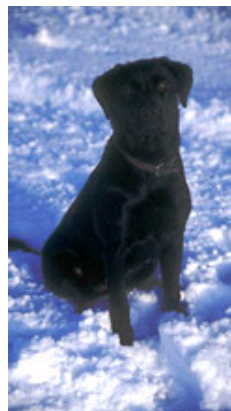
